Acts 3:

¹ One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer--at three in the afternoon.



Acts 3:

² Now a man who was lame from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg



Acts 3:

from those going into the temple courts. ³ When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. ⁴ Peter looked straight at him,

as did John. Then Peter said,
“Look at us!” ⁵ So the man gave
them his attention, expecting to
get something from them. ⁶

"Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk!"

⁷ Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. ⁸ He jumped to his feet and began to walk!

Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God!

⁹ When all the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰ they recognized him as the same man who used to sit begging at the temple gate

1³ The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus.



Acts 3:

You handed him over to be killed, and you disowned him before Pilate, though he had decided to let him go. ¹⁴ You disowned the Holy and Righteous One

and asked that a murderer be released to you. ¹⁵ You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this.

**¹⁶ By faith in the name of Jesus,
this man whom you see and
know was made strong.**

It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has completely healed him, as you can all see.



Acts 3:

¹⁷ Now, brothers and sisters, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders.

¹⁸ But this is how God fulfilled what he had foretold



Acts 3:

through all the prophets, saying
that his Messiah would suffer.¹⁹
Repent, then, and turn to God,
so that your sins may be wiped
out,



Acts 3:

that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, ²⁰ and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you-- even Jesus.



Acts 3:

²¹ Heaven must receive him until the time comes for God to restore everything, as he promised long ago through his holy prophets. ²² For Moses said,



Acts 3:

'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you must listen to everything he tells you.

²³ Anyone who does not listen to him will be completely cut off from their people.' ²⁴ "Indeed, beginning with Samuel, all the prophets who have spoken

he sent him first to you to bless you by turning each of you from your wicked ways."







(pronounced '*Meen-hah*')








Us and the lame man






